- It's important because the students can make friends with other nationality ones.

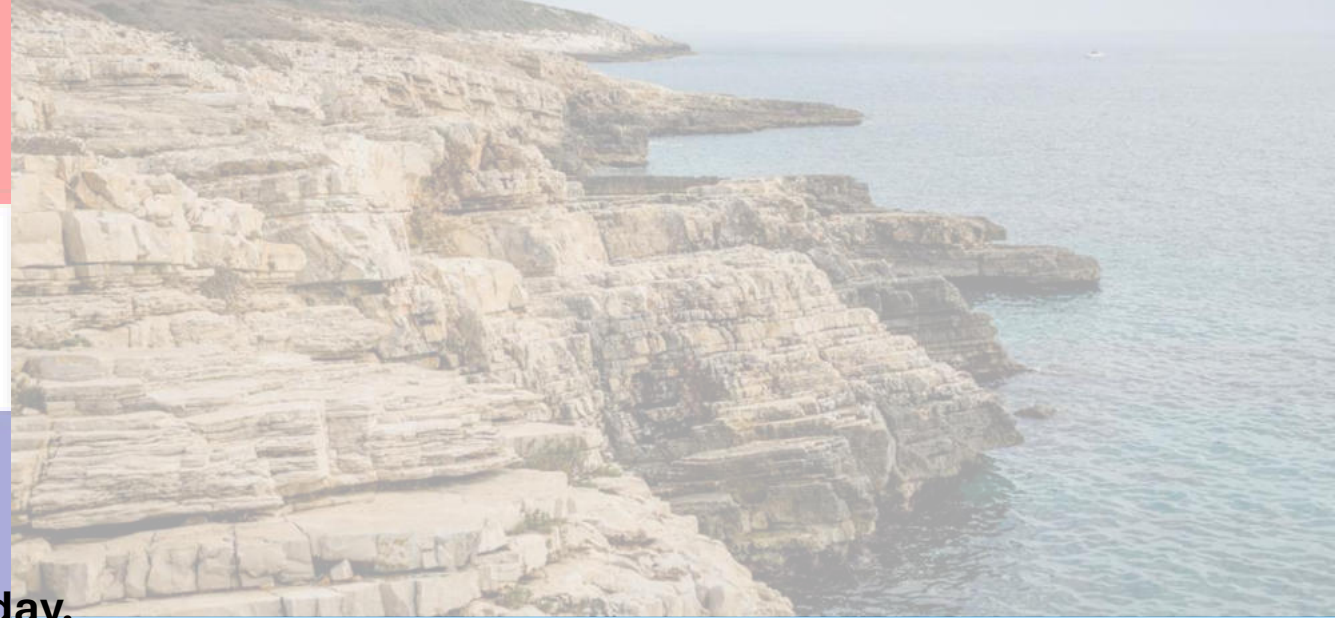

What did we do there?

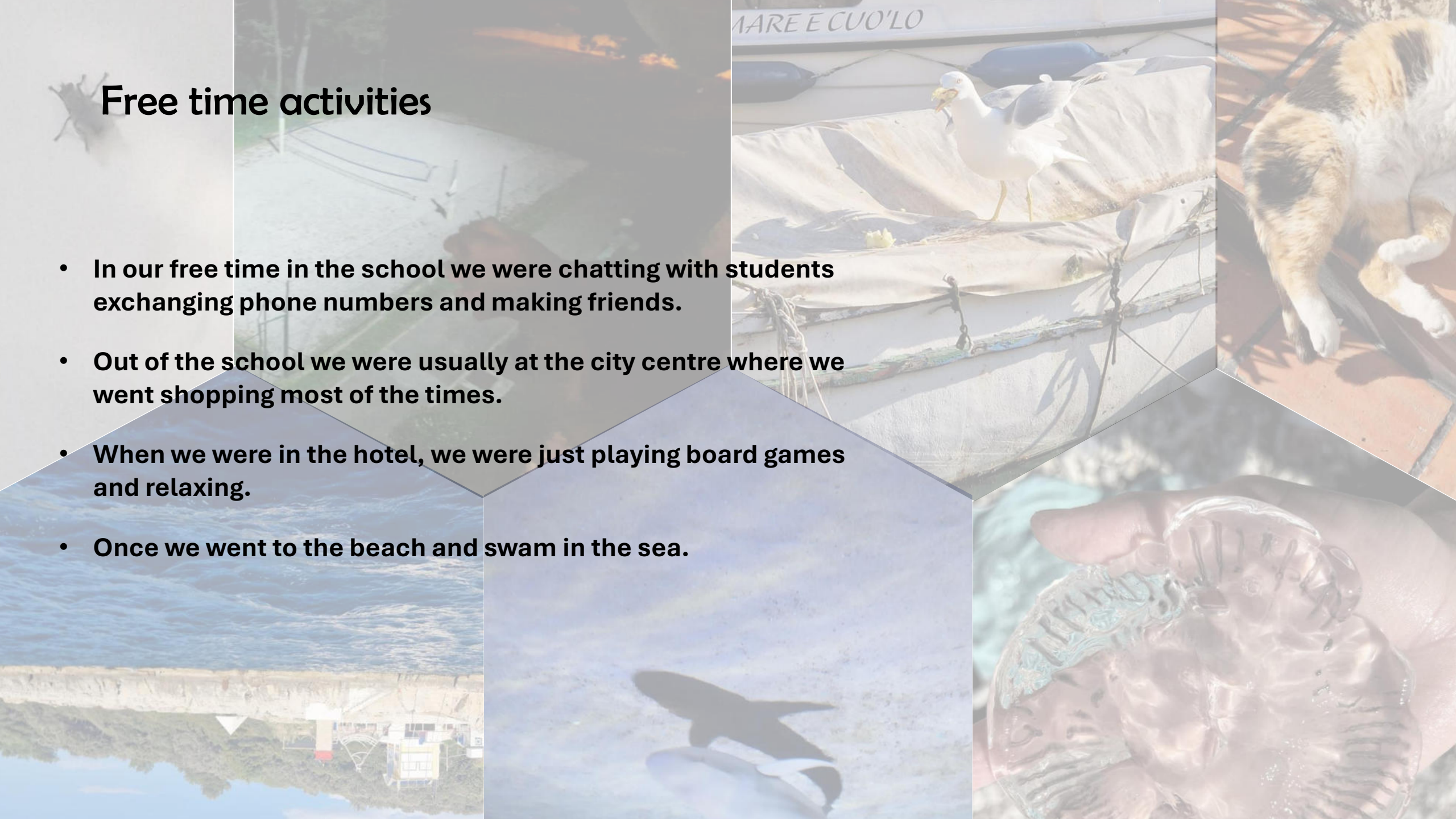
Our group had a lot of and really good programs:

Free time activities

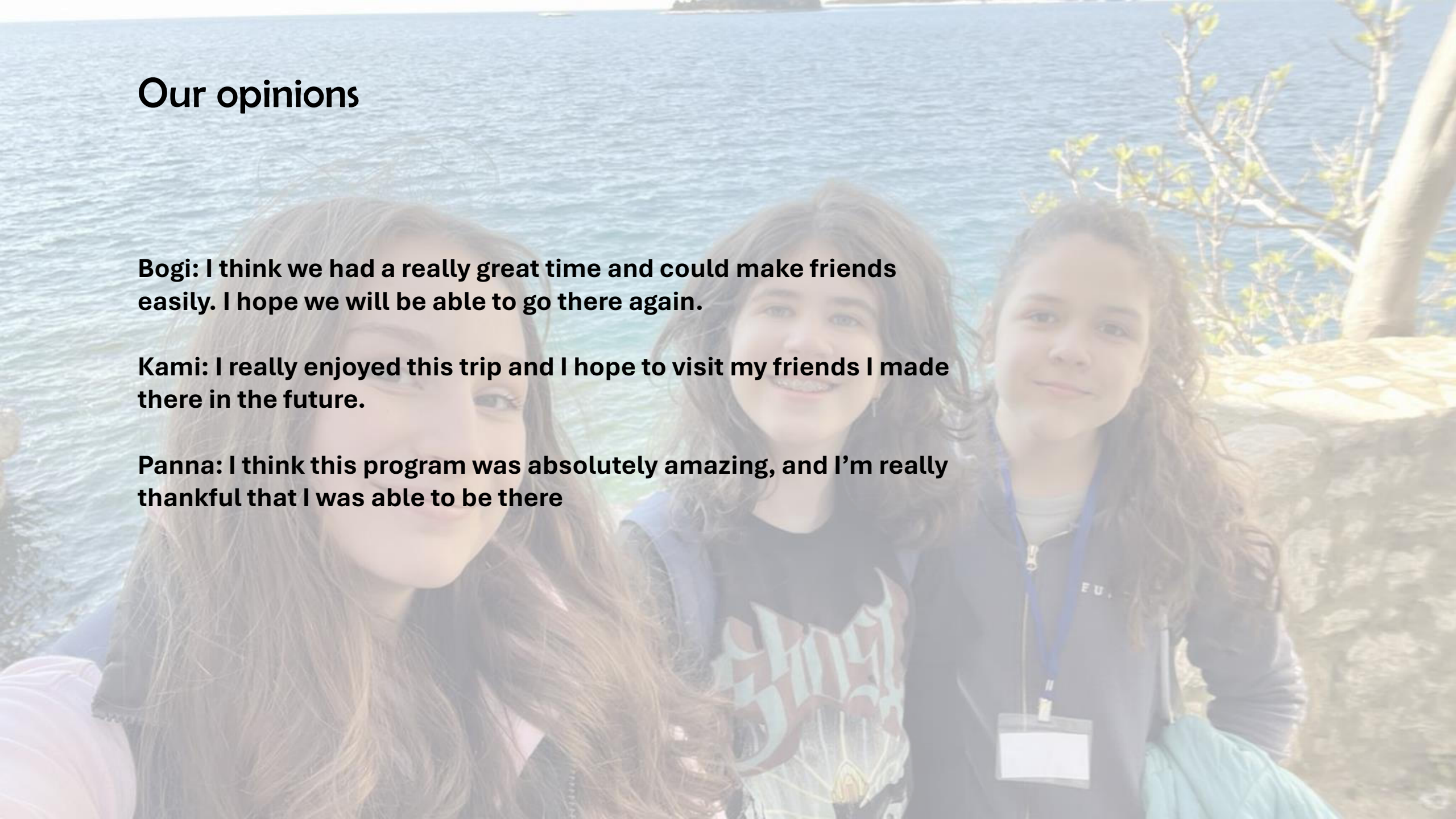
- In our free time in the school we were chatting with students exchanging phone numbers and making friends.
